The Law bachelor's degree in Belfort is a general legal training which offers strong skills in both public and private Law, with interdisciplinary courses in economics, sociology, ecology, English and computer science.

The program aims to master theoretical knowledge in Law and legal terminology, as well as practical legal techniques such as dissertations, case commentaries, legal document analysis, practical cases, and dispute resolution. It also focuses on developing essential skills in written and oral expression necessary for drafting legal documents, alongside proficiency in computer tools and legal English.

This program is delivered by teacher-researchers affiliated with the Franche-Comté Legal Research Center, supported by legal professionals.

The close interaction between teachers and students, facilitated by the small size of the institution, ensures personalized support and individualized guidance for students.

● Course objective

The Law degree enables mastery of legal reasoning, fundamental concepts, and knowledge, as well as the ability to synthesize information and develop critical thinking skills.

It also provides cross-disciplinary competencies in economics, management, sociology, socio-ecological transition, and human resources.

● Profile

The Law degree is primarily aimed at high school graduates with strong writing skills and who have achieved a grade of at least 12/20 in at least two subjects among French, History-Geography, and Philosophy.

Initial training or continuing education (resumption of studies or Validation of Acquired Experience - VAE).

First year: high school graduates + holders of a DAEU (Diploma of Access to University Studies) + legal aptitude.

Second year: graduates from first year of Law or AES + DUT Legal careers or BTS Notarial studies through validation of acquired experience (VA) upon decision of an academic committee.

Third year: graduates from second year of Law + validation of acquired experience (VA) or validation of prior learning (VAE) upon decision of an academic committee.

● Career opportunities

The career opportunities are numerous:

- Public service competitive exams (court clerk, labor inspector, tax administration officer, territorial officer, Police or Gendarmerie officer, youth judicial protection educator, probation and reintegration advisor, etc.)
- European Union exams and parliamentary assembly exams.
- Competitive exams for legal professions (lawyer, notary, judicial officer, administrative and judicial magistrate)
- Legal professions in the private sector (notary clerk, banking advisor, insurance advisor, business advisor, human resources manager, communication professionals, real estate professionals, etc.)

● Further studies

- Master's degrees in Law (public law, private law, business law, criminal sciences)
- Master's degrees in the field of Law-Economics-Management (human resources management, political life, etc.)
- Professional bachelor's degrees in the field of Law-Economics-Management
- Integrated preparatory classes for tax services and IRAs.
- Access through competitive exams to legal professions (lawyer, notary, judicial officer, administrative and judicial magistrate).
- Pursuit of a PhD



● Courses' content

Autonomy is gradually acquired.

The first year consists in an introduction to the two main branches of Law (public and private Law), with the acquisition of legal, economic, and historical knowledge. From the start, learning methods play an important role thanks to tutorials provided in the main subjects.

The second year emphasizes the legal aspect of the training while maintaining the dual objective : general legal education and the importance of methodology.

The third year completes the generalist curriculum by combining public and private Law courses with tutorials and offering a discovery internship.

Throughout the course, students participate in professional project workshops.
